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INTRODUCTION

THE DATASET ENTITLED NATIONAL JUDICIAL REPORTING PROGRAM, 1986 UNITED STATES PROVIDES DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE SENTENCES CONVICTED FELONS RECEIVED IN STATE COURTS IN 1986. THE DATASET IS COMPOSED OF INDIVIDUAL RECORDS ON 55,966 CONVICTED FELONS SELECTED TO BE REPRESENTATIVE OF CONVICTED FELONS NATIONWIDE. TOGETHER THE 55,966 CASES FORM A PROBABILITY SAMPLE OF CONVICTED FELONS SENTENCED IN STATE COURTS IN 1986. FOR EACH FELON, INFORMATION WAS COMPILED ON THE FELONY CONVICTION OFFENSE, THE SENTENCE RECEIVED, AND SELECTED DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS.

BACKGROUND

A GAP EXISTS IN AMERICAN CRIMINAL JUSTICE STATISTICS: THERE ARE NO DETAILED NATIONAL COURT STATISTICS. IN FACT, THE UNITED STATES IS ONE OF ONLY A FEW WESTERN NATIONS THAT HAS NO NATIONAL COURT STATISTICS. THERE ARE POLICE STATISTICS COMPILED ANNUALLY THAT RECORD THE NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED IN THE UNITED STATES; AND, THERE ARE NATIONAL PRISON STATISTICS COMPILED ANNUALLY THAT SHOW THE NUMBER OF PERSONS SENT TO PRISON. BUT THERE ARE NO NATIONWIDE STATISTICS THAT SHOW WHAT HAPPENS BETWEEN ARREST AND IMPRISONMENT.

THE NATIONAL JUDICIAL REPORTING PROGRAM (NJRP) IS A STATISTICAL SERIES INTENDED TO CLOSE THE GAP IN AMERICAN CRIMINAL JUSTICE STATISTICS. SPONSORED BY THE BUREAU OF JUSTICE STATISTICS (BJS), THE PROGRAM COMPILES REPRESENTATIVE STATISTICAL DATA ON SAMPLES OF PERSONS CONVICTED OF FELONIES IN STATE COURTS. THESE DATA MAKE IT POSSIBLE TO ANSWER NUMEROUS QUESTIONS ABOUT FELONY COURTS THAT UP TO NOW COULD NOT BE ANSWERED FROM AVAILABLE SOURCES -- QUESTIONS SUCH AS:

*NATIONWIDE, HOW MANY PERSONS ARE
CONVICTED OF FELONIES IN A YEAR?

*HOW MANY CONVICTED FELONS RECEIVE
A JURY TRIAL?

*WHAT PERCENTAGE OF CONVICTED FELONS
RECEIVE A PRISON SENTENCE?

*WHAT IS THE AVERAGE LENGTH OF PROBATION
SENTENCES FOR DRUG TRAFFICKING?

DATA COLLECTION

THE 55,966 SAMPLE CASES THAT MAKE UP THE DATASET WERE SELECTED FROM 115 STATE COURTS IN 100 COUNTIES LOCATED THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES. STATE COURTS WERE THE SOURCE OF DATA FOR 61 COUNTIES; STATE PROSECUTORS, FOR 16 COUNTIES; AND STATE COURTS AND STATE PROSECUTORS COMBINED, FOR 5 COUNTIES. SOURCES FOR THE REMAINING 18 COUNTIES VARIED.

FOR 47 COUNTIES DATA WERE OBTAINED FROM COMPUTER PRINTOUT; FOR 21 COUNTIES, MAGNETIC TAPE; FOR 17 COUNTIES, FIELD DATA COLLECTION; AND FOR THE REMAINING 15 COUNTIES, OTHER DOCUMENTS WERE SUPPLIED BY ONE OF THE PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED SOURCES.

DATA COLLECTION FROM OFFICIAL COUNTY RECORDS INVOLVED TWO IMMEDIATE TASKS: 1) DIFFERENTIATING FELONY OFFENSES FROM MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES, AND SELECTING OUT ONLY CASES OF FELONY CONVICTION; AND, 2) CLASSIFYING EACH FELONY CONVICTION CASE ACCORDING TO THE NJRP OFFENSE CLASSIFICATION SCHEME. THE BASIS FOR TASK #1 WAS THE BJS PUBLICATION FELONY LAWS OF THE 50 STATES AND THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, 1986 (NCJ-105066, DECEMBER 1987). THE PUBLICATION LISTS EACH STATE'S FELONY LAWS BY STATUTE NUMBER AND TITLE. STATUTORY INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE PUBLICATION WAS COMPILED FROM EACH STATE'S 1986 ANNOTATED CODE.

THE BASIS FOR CLASSIFYING EACH FELONY CONVICTION CASE ACCORDING TO THE NJRP OFFENSE CLASSIFICATION SCHEME WAS EACH STATE'S 1986 ANNOTATED CODE. DURING THE COMPILATION OF STATE FELONY STATUTES FOR THE PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED PUBLICATION, THE WORDING OF INDIVIDUAL FELONY STATUTES WAS CLOSELY EXAMINED TO DETERMINE THE APPROPRIATE NJRP OFFENSE CLASSIFICATION CODE FOR EACH STATUTE. STATUTES CONFORMING TO THE NJRP DEFINITION OF MURDER OR NONNEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER WERE CODED 1; STATUTES CONFORMING TO THE NJRP RAPE DEFINITION, CODED 2; ROBBERY, 3; AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, 4; BURGLARY, 5; LARCENY OR MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT, 6; DRUG TRAFFICKING, 7; AND OTHER FELONY, 8. APPENDIX C PROVIDES ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ABOUT CLASSIFICATION OF STATE STATUTES.

WEIGHTING

SAMPLE DATA WERE GATHERED IN A SURVEY THAT USED A TWO-STAGE STRATIFIED CLUSTER SAMPLING DESIGN. AT THE FIRST STAGE, 100 COUNTIES WERE SELECTED FROM THE NATION'S 3,109 COUNTIES. AT THE SECOND STAGE, A SYSTEMATIC SAMPLE OF CONVICTED FELONS WAS SELECTED WITHIN EACH COUNTY. FIRST STAGE SAMPLING RATES ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE DATASET AS V60 "STRATA WEIGHT," DEFINED AS THE INVERSE OF THE PROBABILITY OF SELECTION OF THE COUNTY. SECOND STAGE SAMPLING RATES ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE DATASET AS V72 "SECOND STAGE SAMPLING RATES," DEFINED AS THE INVERSE OF THE PROBABILITY OF SELECTION OF A FELON CONVICTED OF A SPECIFIED OFFENSE WITHIN THE COUNTY. A THIRD SAMPLING RATE IS V62 "NATIONAL WEIGHT," DEFINED AS THE INVERSE OF PROBABILITY OF SELECTION OF THE COUNTY (V60) MULTIPLIED BY THE INVERSE OF THE PROBABILITY OF SELECTION OF THE CONVICTED FELON WITHIN THE COUNTY (V62). INDIVIDUAL COUNTIES ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE DATASET BY THEIR VALUE ON V69 "FIPS CODE."

WEIGHTING CASES BY V72 AND THEN AGGREGATING THEM ACCORDING TO THEIR V69 COUNTY CODE PROVIDE ESTIMATES AT THE COUNTY LEVEL. WEIGHTING CASES BY V62 AND THEN AGGREGATING THEM ACROSS ALL COUNTIES PROVIDES ESTIMATES AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL. WEIGHTING CASES BY V62 AND THEN AGGREGATING THEM ACCORDING TO THEIR STRATUM CODE ON V59 "FIRST STAGE SAMPLING STRATA" PROVIDES ESTIMATES AT THE STRATUM LEVEL. AN EXAMPLE OF THE LATTER IS AN ESTIMATE BASED ON CASES WITH V59 STRATUM CODES OF 1 AND 3 AND WEIGHTED BY V62. STRATUM CODES 1 AND 3 DESIGNATE CASES FROM THE 75 LARGEST COUNTIES OF THE U.S. (AS DEFINED BY THEIR 1986 RESIDENT POPULATION), AND CASES HAVING THESE STRATUM CODES PROVIDE ESTIMATES FOR THE 75 LARGEST COUNTIES WHEN WEIGHTED BY V62 AND AGGREGATED.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ABOUT SAMPLING, SAMPLING ERROR ESTIMATES, PARTICIPATING COUNTIES, SOURCES OF DATA, TARGETED POPULATION, CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SAMPLE, CRIME DEFINITION, NONRESPONSE, AND OTHER DATA COLLECTION MATTERS IS PROVIDED IN FOUR SOURCES: "THE SCALES OF JUSTICE: SENTENCING OUTCOMES IN 39 FELONY COURTS, 1986," BY MARK A. CUNNIFF, JUNE 30, 1988, REPORT SUBMITTED TO BUREAU OF JUSTICE STATISTICS PURSUANT TO GRANT #82-BJ-CX-K046; NJRP "FIELD INTERVIEWER'S MANUAL," AVAILABLE FROM GOVERNMENTS DIVISION, CENSUS BUREAU; "NATIONAL JUDICIAL REPORTING PROGRAM FEASIBILITY STUDY: 1986 EVALUATION REPORT," BY BETTY FORD, BUREAU OF THE CENSUS, MARCH 14, 1989; AND "FELONY SENTENCES IN STATE COURTS, 1986," THE INITIAL PUBLISHED REPORT SUMMARIZING SURVEY FINDINGS. A COPY OF THE PUBLICATION IS FOUND IN APPENDIX D. NOTE THAT THE PUBLICATION IS BASED ON 51,594 CASES OUT OF THE TOTAL SAMPLE OF 55,966 CASES. THE 4,372 CASES NOT USED IN THE PUBLICATION WERE OVERSAMPLED CASES; I.E., CASES IN 8 COUNTIES WHERE RATES AT WHICH CASES WERE SAMPLED EXCEEDED RATES PRESCRIBED FOR NATIONAL ESTIMATION PURPOSES. THE 4,372 CASES ARE IN THE DATASET BUT HAVE A VALUE OF ZERO ON BOTH V62 "NATIONAL WEIGHT" AND V72 "SECOND STATE SAMPLING RATES."

FILE STRUCTURE

THE NATIONAL JUDICIAL REPORTING PROGRAM, 1986: UNITED STATES IS AVAILABLE FROM THE ICPSR IN TWO FORMATS: CARD IMAGE AND OSIRIS. THE CARD IMAGE FILE CONTAINS SEVERAL DECKS PER CASE IN A FORMAT BASED ON 80 COLUMN PUNCHED CARDS. THE DATA ARE SORTED BY CASE WITH ALL DECKS FOR A CASE TOGETHER IN ASCENDING ORDER.

THE OSIRIS DICTIONARY GIVES THE FORMAT AND OTHER INFORMATION FOR EACH VARIABLE IN THE OSIRIS DATA FILE. THE DICTIONARY OR DICTIONARY-CODEBOOK FILE IS USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE OSIRIS SOFTWARE PACKAGE. THE OSIRIS DATA FILE IS CONSTRUCTED WITH A SINGLE LOGICAL RECORD FOR EACH CASE. THERE ARE 72 VARIABLES ON 55,966 CASES.

THE OSIRIS DATA FILE CAN BE ACCESSED DIRECTLY THROUGH SOFTWARE PACKAGES OR PROGRAMS WHICH DO NOT USE THE OSIRIS DICTIONARY BY SPECIFYING THE TAPE LOCATION OF THE DESIRED VARIABLES. THESE TAPE LOCATIONS ARE GIVEN IN THE OSIRIS DICTIONARY-CODEBOOK.

CODEBOOK INFORMATION

THE EXAMPLE BELOW IS A REPRODUCTION OF INFORMATION APPEARING IN THE MACHINE-READABLE CODEBOOK FOR A TYPICAL VARIABLE. THE NUMBERS IN BRACKETS DO NOT APPEAR BUT ARE REFERENCES TO THE DESCRIPTIONS WHICH FOLLOW THIS EXAMPLE.

- 1 INDICATES THE VARIABLE AND REFERENCE NUMBERS. A VARIABLE NUMBER AND A REFERENCE NUMBER ARE ASSIGNED TO EACH VARIABLE IN THE DATA COLLECTION. IN THE PRESENT CODEBOOK WHICH DOCUMENTS THE ARCHIVED DATA COLLECTION THESE NUMBERS ARE IDENTICAL. SHOULD THE DATA BE SUBSETTED OR REARRANGED BY AN OSIRIS PROGRAM (E.G., MMP TO INTERSPERSE DATA FROM ANOTHER SOURCE, OR TCOT TO PRODUCE AN ANALYSIS DECK), THE VARIABLE NUMBERS WOULD CHANGE TO REFLECT THE ORDER OF THE NEW DATA COLLECTION, WHILE THE REFERENCE NUMBER WOULD REMAIN UNCHANGED TO REFLECT THE VARIABLE NUMBER IN THE CODEBOOK DESCRIBING THE ARCHIVED DATA COLLECTION.
- 2 INDICATES THE ABBREVIATED VARIABLE NAME (MAXIMUM OF 24 CHARACTERS) USED IN THE OSIRIS SYSTEM TO IDENTIFY THE VARIABLE FOR THE USER. AN EXPANDED VERSION OF THE VARIABLE NAME CAN BE FOUND IN THIS INTRODUCTION IN THE VARIABLE DESCRIPTION LIST.
- 3 INDICATES THE CODE VALUES OF MISSING DATA. IN THIS EXAMPLE, CODE VALUES EQUAL TO 95 OR GREATER THAN OR EQUAL TO 99 ARE MISSING DATA (MD=95 OR GE 99). ALTERNATIVE STATEMENTS FOR OTHER VARIABLES ARE "MD=0," "MD GE 98," OR "NO MISSING DATA CODES." SOME ANALYSIS SOFTWARE PACKAGES (INCLUDING THE OSIRIS SOFTWARE PACKAGE) REQUIRE THAT CERTAIN TYPES OF DATA WHICH THE USER DESIRES TO BE EXCLUDED FROM ANALYSIS BE DESIGNATED AS "MISSING DATA," E.G., INAPPROPRIATE, UNASCERTAINED, UNASCERTAINABLE, OR AMBIGUOUS DATA CATEGORIES. ALTHOUGH THESE CODES ARE DEFINED AS MISSING DATA CATEGORIES, THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT THE USER SHOULD NOT OR CANNOT USE THEM IN A SUBSTANTIVE ROLE IF SO DESIRED.
- 4 INDICATES THE STARTING LOCATION AND WIDTH OF THIS VARIABLE WHEN THE DATA ARE STORED ON A MAGNETIC TAPE IN THE OSIRIS FORMAT. ICPSR PROCESSING INFORMATION

THE DATA COLLECTION WAS PROCESSED ACCORDING TO THE STANDARD ICPSR PROCESSING PROCEDURES. THE DATA WERE CHECKED FOR ILLEGAL OR INCONSISTENT CODE VALUES WHICH, WHEN FOUND, WERE RECODED TO OSIRIS MISSING DATA VALUES. NO CONSISTENCY CHECKS WERE PERFORMED.
